
## Red Start Football

All through the year, I monitor absences and late arrivals for all pupils and I share this with our Home School Liaison Office, Mrs Laurenson. It is very important that your child attends school and I have included an interesting diagram which highlights the importance of your child attending school every day. We do understand that when a child is ill and they are unable to attend school, however, there are number of pupils who have an attendance rate below 85% and this can have a huge impact on their learning. It is recommended that your child should not have an attendance rate of below 95% as this gives them the best chances in making progress in their education. Every school day counts!
