Safety

It is of upmost importance to us that the children are safe. However in the last week I have seen parents parking in the school car park and allowing young children to walk through unsupervised. Parents, carers, relatives, friends should NOT use the front school car park (Stronsay Place) to drop off or collect children at the beginning or end of the school day.

The car park on Stronsay Drive, which was used for the contractors will not be re-opening, as the children have requested that this area be used for new playground equipment. I appreciate that for some parents this has been tricky, but once again may I remind you that Rev Shewan is kindly allowing us to park in his car park at Summerhill Church. We are actively encouraging children to walk to school, or park and stride (drive most of the way to school and walk the last few hundred metres).

School Improvement Plan

As part of our last Inservice day in November, the staff worked hard on our Maths challenges. Schools across our ASG (Associated School Group - Airyhall, Hazlehead Primary, Kingsford and Hazlehead Academy) have been working together designing challenges for all the children to complete. This has allowed the staff to agree common standards of work and assessments. The staff have also visited each other in different schools, again to ensure there is a similar standard and shared expectations of children's progress for all our children.

The staff also worked on updating our Health and Wellbeing programme across the school. We hope to have assessors coming in to speak with us in January about the work we have been doing with children, parents and the community over the last few years. Finally staff were again reviewing the use of ipads across the school to support learning. I

must say I am seeing children actively engaged in meaningful learning tasks using ipads from Nursery to P7. We plan to purchase some more next term so that more children can access them more regularly. It was a very busy day.

Care Inspectorate Visit

Last week we received our unannounced visit from the Care Inspectorate to review our nursery provision across the school. This process happens every 2/3 years although we submit information to the care inspectorate on an annual basis. Thank you to those parents who were randomly selected to complete questionnaires and also to the parents who came in to chat with the inspector on Friday morning. We hope the report will be issued in January.

Charities update

Well done and thank you to everyone who supported our efforts for Children in Need. We raised £320.80 which was fabulous. Also we have finally managed to count all the coppers from Jeans for Genes day and we raised £462.54. It is great to see the children participating and being responsible citizens, thinking about others.
