School Improvement Plan

On our last in-service day, all the teaching staff spent the day working on reading approaches with our colleagues at Hazlehead Primary School. This is part of our plan to refresh our reading approaches in school. As a result, there will be some changes to reading, particularly from P5-7. We are currently trialling ERIC (Everyone Reading In Class) for 10 minutes after either break or lunchtime. This is a time for all children to read a book of their choice for a short spell in school everyday. We hope that this will encourage children to read for enjoyment. Following suggestions made in our most recent questionnaires, children will also be completing book reviews to share their opinions about books, allowing them to be critics and also have the opportunity to form views about different types (genres) of books.
