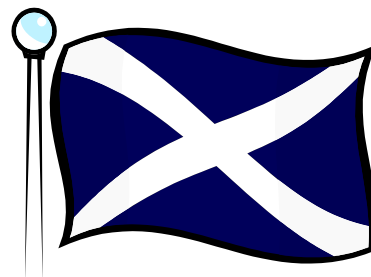
Staffing

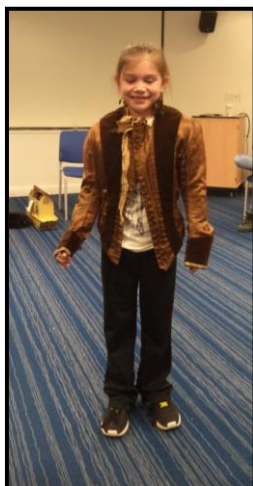
P6 Victorian Trip

The P6 class went on a trip around Aberdeen to learn about the Victorians. We looked at Victorian buildings - churches, schools, banks and houses.
