Early Learning and Childcare Expansion Consultation

Aberdeen City Council is carrying out a statutory consultation exercise linked to the Scottish Government's programme for the expansion of early learning and childcare. The Government's intention is to expand the offer of funded early learning and childcare to 1140 hours per annum for some two year olds and all three and four year olds, whose parents want such a service by 2020.

It is important that they gather information from parents, carers and potential future parents regarding how best services could be provided. A series of consultation events have been organised to consider the Scottish Government's programme of expansion of early learning and childcare entitlement. A Survey Monkey questionnaire has also been launched to gather as many views as possible.

They have undertaken a strategic review of existing services and options related to the delivery of expanded provision have been identified.
