## **The European Christmas Decoration Exchange Project**

This term P4 are taking part in an exciting project: The European Christmas Decoration Exchange Project. So while it is maybe a little early to be getting ready for Christmas, P4 have already started making Christmas decorations to send to 30 different schools across Europe! Our decorations will be sent to Poland, Croatia, Cyprus, Greece, Italy and France to name a few. Along with the decoration, we will be sending an information booklet about Aberdeen and how we celebrate Christmas here in Scotland. Then in December we will receive decorations from these same 30 countries which we will display on our school Christmas Tree.

We are looking forward to finding out about these countries and how they celebrate Christmas as well as receiving hand-made decorations from across Europe.

## **Community Survey**

P1-7 Pupils were given the opportunity to discuss and evaluate the community they live and learn in. They were asked to work within a group, with children from different classes, to rate aspects of the school, playground and community. They were rating them HOT or NOT. The sessions went really well and good quality responses and discussions took place. The information is being collated so that it can help us formulate a plan on how we can begin to make differences in our school community.

Some of the main things that were rated as HOT (things they liked) were:

clubs after school, the green spaces, trips, clubs/activities in the community, having a garden to play in, delicious school dinners.

Some of the things that were rated as NOT (things they didn't like) were: not being able to sleep because of noisy neighbours, dog mess, litter, not enough parking, flooding, bullying, people who damage things in our community.

As you can see the children identified a huge range of positive and negative issues that we can consider further.

## **Flood Management Project**

Next week, the P5/6 class will begin to work with Marina who is a Dee Catchment Development Officer. They will look at the school grounds and begin to plan and address the flood issues that we currently experience at Fernielea. Marina will also work with other classes over the course of Terms 2 and 3. The Aberdeen City Council Flood Engineers will also be working with the children. Plans to upgrade our playground are being considered in order to manage the flooding that impacts on us year on year. Further information about the project will be shared over the course of the year and you will also be invited to be involved, so please be prepared to join in!

## **Poppies**

Next week, P5 will be selling Poppies for Remembrance. Poppies can be 'bought' in return for a donation. P5 pupils will go round each class in the mornings giving everyone the chance to buy a poppy. Safety pins will be provided to secure the poppies. P5 are performing their Remembrance assembly on Friday 11 November and parents from P5 are welcome to attend.



## Parent Council

Our Parent Council AGM was held on 27<sup>th</sup> October and was attended by a small number of parents. An overview of the year in terms of fundraising and achievements was shared by the Chair and the Treasurer and an overview of the school's progress and the highlights of the year were shared by Mrs Walker. This session so far, we have held an Internet Safety Awareness event for parents at Hazlehead Academy, an Early Reading workshop and a Reading for P3-7 workshop. We have also planned an Anti-bullying workshop for parents that will hopefully be held on the evening of November 30<sup>th</sup>.
