Parking

Over the last few weeks of term, I was observing the parking situation around the school. It became clear that a number of parents and carers were making use of the school car parks to drop off or collect their children. I spoke to a number of parents and grandparents to make them aware that they are not permitted to use the car parks for this purpose and they were putting their child's life in danger by allowing them to walk in the car park. Both of our car parks are VERY busy with cars, vans and lorries reversing at all times of the day. There is a clearly marked path that should be used at <u>all times</u> for children to safely walk into the playground.

I also observed parents stopping on the yellow zig-zag lines and double yellow lines to 'quickly' drop their child off. This is not acceptable as it put your child's life and the lives of others in danger. It is a very busy road to cross and the children need clear visibility to check for oncoming traffic.

We are currently looking to recruit a crossing patroller for Fernielea School so please spread the word to anyone you know who may have some spare time and would like to help to keep our pupils safe.
