Parent Council Update

Members of the Parent Council went to the National Parent Forum of Scotland Annual Conference held in Edinburgh. This was a day of learning about parental involvement and engagement giving us all an opportunity to come together, share ideas and learn from each other, finding out that we are not alone when it comes to parental engagement.

We listened to keynote speakers who explained and discussed that parental involvement is about supporting your child and their learning through various routes; encouraging partnerships between school and parents to work together with schools opening their doors and inviting parents in, as they are the most powerful allies in a child's education. It was reinforced throughout the day, that when parents are involved in their child's education, it benefits children, families and schools, resulting in the child doing better.

We attended several workshops:

- 'Fathers Network Scotland' highlighting the benefits of involving dads in education and
 offering suggestions and insight to actively support Dads to be part of their child's
 education.
- 'RespectMe' Scotland's Anti-bullying service offering parents the opportunity to work
 alongside schools to influence policies and sharing practical skills to help parents support
 children who are bullied and those who display bullying behaviours.
- 'Children's Aid' examining and discussing effective strategies to actively engage parents as partners in education.
- 'Enquire' advice and information on how schools and families can work together to ensure children with additional support needs get the support they need.

We came away feeling inspired, motivated and very passionate about being involved and engaged in our child's education. We learned that "we" as parents have a space and a place within school and that your child is actually really keen for you to be involved.

Scooting/Cycling in School

After the Easter holidays, there will be a safe scoot zone being trialled in the P3-7 playground for P3-7 only. It will allow children to scoot in the playground within the designated zone only. This will be a trial for 2 weeks and we will seek feedback from pupils and their families after the 2 weeks have ended. The pupil council and parent council will be consulted about the trial and whether or not this can continue for the rest of the term. As we are looking to increase pedestrian safety, children will be expected to remain in the scooter zone displaying responsible scooting behaviours. Children should be wearing a helmet to school if they are entering the scooter zone. There will be no exceptions to this. Thank you.



Community Squad

This term, we introduced our Community Squad. Every week, children sign up to volunteer their time, usually during Wednesday lunchbreak, to do something to enhance or support the school community. The volunteers have had great fun washing the bike shelters, washing windows and they will be weeding, planting, litter picking and even upcycling furniture.

Some P7s have already learned how to sand a chair, tighten up screws to stop it wobbling and they then decorated the chair so that the children in the nursery could use it in their new shed. Everything the volunteers do allows them to develop skills for life and encourages them to keep going to ensure a task is finished. The learn how to work with others to achieve an end goal. When children volunteer they record it on their time sheet and when they have volunteered 5 times, they are awarded the Bronze Volunteering Award, 10 times for Silver and 15 times for Gold. All volunteers will be rewarded with a tea party at the end of term to say 'thank you for helping our community'. Next term we will be asking if any adults would like to volunteer too.
