Homework Club

Since August, we have offered a Homework Club for all pupils from P2-P7. This has been possible through Pupil Equity Funding (PEF). The club has grown in size and we now have over 50 pupils attending. Parents are welcome to come along to the club and learn alongside their child. After Easter, we will be offering places to P1 pupils so look out for information coming out.

When your child attends Homework Club, they get a snack and then work in a small group to complete their homework tasks. Staff are on hand to support them if they need any help.

Please note that reading still needs to be completed at home regularly and spelling needs to be practised. Homework needs to be signed by a parent or carer.

Dogs in the Playground

Many of our families have dogs and while they are very cute and very much loved by their families, we still don't allow dogs in the playground. Your dog may be gentle with you and your family but they may be wary around strangers and it would be very sad if your dog nipped at a child or member of the public. Staff upload learning journeys for parents and children to see at home and the parents can also upload achievements and learning that takes place outside school. It was a very positive session. Scooting/Cycling in School

We are very proud to be one of the top schools for scooting and cycling to school. However, some pupils are making it very difficult for pedestrians by scooting on the pedestrian pathways into school and in the playground after 8.30am. Work is being carried out with the P7 pupils to design and reinforce the scooting/cycling rules in order to keep pedestrians safe.

The pupils say:

- If scooting or cycling to school, you should be wearing a helmet.
- No scooting/cycling down the school pedestrian paths.
- No scooting/cycling should be done between the hours of 8.30am and 9am and 3.00pm and 3.30pm to allow the nursery pupils to go through the playground safely.
- During allowed hours, if a pedestrian is walking in the playground you must stop scooting/cycling to let them pass.
 - If you break the rules you will be given a warning which will allow you the chance to change your behaviour.
 - If you break the rules a second time you will lose Golden Time.
 - If you break the rules a third time you will receive a scooting/cycling ban for a week and your parents will be informed.

The pupils have also requested a safe scooting zone beside the bike shelters, so a trial period of this will begin after the Easter break. More information will be shared nearer the time.
