School Parking

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that it is <u>not permitted</u> for parents to use the school car park for dropping children off. It is very dangerous and it is for the safety of YOUR child. There are various parking options for you to make use of - Summerhill Parish Church car park, Fernielea Gospel Hall car park and the various streets around the school. No one should be parking on the yellow lines and no one should be <u>mounting</u> the pavement. Again, it is for the safety of YOUR child. The school is working closely with the Community wardens and local police to ensure that everyone is parking safely and considerately. Please do not park on Stronsay Drive as it causes an obstruction.

Our Transport Pupil Voice group are assessing the parking dangers and safe routes to school this term. If you do have to park in the school car park, it is REVERSE parking only. This applies to After School Club pick-ups and drop-offs also.

Homework Club

The Homework Club was a huge success last year with a number of parents regularly attending every week. Before the holidays, over 60 children accessed the club every Monday.

We will be starting the Homework Club again on Monday 1st October. It runs from 3.15-4pm with the children getting a healthy snack and a drink before the club starts (3-3.15pm). Parents are strongly encouraged to attend with their child as it is a very valuable experience where parents can be supported to help their child with maths and literacy. All children wishing to attend Homework Club must complete and return the letter that will be issued later this week - even if they attended last year.

Over the Summer break we had our ICT room turned into our new library. It is going to be a vibrant and engaging environment for our families to engage with books and develop a love of reading together. The Library and Reading Pupil Voice group are busy planning the launch of the new library. The project has been funded by the school and the Parent Council.

Pupil Participation

As part of our school interventions for pupil equity (PEF) we teamed up with Active School to provide free clubs for our children. This intervention saw the participation rate for our school rise by 82% last year which is phenomenal. It saw 53% of our pupils participating in at least one activity. Thank you to our parent volunteers who supported the activities and a huge thank you to Wendy Carrick for organising all of the clubs. We are continuing this intervention this year, so please encourage your child to attend at least one of the opportunities provided.

Parent Council

The Parent Council held a very successful family Bingo night last Thursday. It was attended by families old and new. We are looking forward to the next event, the school disco, which will be held on Wednesday 10th October.

The Parent Council are holding their AGM on Thursday 4th October in Fernielea School.
